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1. Overview of Operating Results for the Fiscal Year Ended March 31, 2025

(1) Operating Results

In the fiscal year ended March 31, 2025 (fiscal 2024), the external environment surrounding the Sanwa Group showed overall solid growth, but still continued to face an uncertain outlook due to concerns over policy developments under the new U.S. administration, stagnation in China's economy, and the expansion of geopolitical risks from the prolonged situation in Ukraine and the Middle East.

Amid this environment, the Sanwa Group embarked on the final year of Mid-Term Management Plan 2024, which is aimed at achieving our long-term management vision, Sanwa Global Vision 2030. In this final year for accomplishing the plan, we continued to work on establishing the foundation to become a global leader of smart entrance solutions that meet the changing needs of society due to climate change and digitalization as well as executing our basic strategies.

Under our basic strategies of expanding and strengthening core businesses in Japan, North America, and Europe, we continued to work to enhance our structure for business expansion, increase the market share of the shutter and door businesses, and, in terms of strategic products, expand our lineup of partition products such as Duo Glass in Japan while introducing gate operators and dock levelers in the Americas. We worked to expand the service business by promoting initiatives tailored to the unique characteristics of each market. To strengthen the basis for growth of the Asian business, amid the deterioration of the Chinese market, we focused on reinforcing efforts to secure sales volume, improving productivity, and meeting the needs of the fire prevention and heat insulation market. To expand products for disaster prevention and climate change response and enhance smart products and services, we expanded the applicable size of the Quick saver TR insulation product in the Re-carbo series of products with high-performing thermal insulation to promote CO2 reduction proposals, and added specifications for specific fireproof equipment to the Soundproof Guard series, further enriching the lineup. In North America and Europe, we also launched products with remote monitoring functions. To increase productivity through digitalization and manufacturing innovation, we invested in expanding production capacity and achieving labor savings, strengthened the door production system in Japan, consolidated our automatic door plants and reorganized sectional door and other plants in the Americas, relocated and expanded our UK door plant in Europe, and pursued digitalization of our door plant in Germany. To enhance sustainability management, we continued efforts to reduce CO2 emissions, including the installation of new solar panels at the Changshu Plant in China, the Shizuoka Plant, and the Ota Door Plant, and to reduce waste, while implementing measures aimed at achieving the key performance indicators (KPIs) tied to environmental, social, and governance (ESG) material issues.

Looking at the operating results by segment, in Japan, we sought to secure profitability and volume through price pass-on in response to rising prices, and solid sales were recorded for core products such as heavy-duty shutters and doors for buildings and condominiums, as well as strategic products, mainly for partitions and entrances. In North America, we advanced measures to expand sales and capture the rebound in the housing market, and worked to reduce costs by maintaining selling prices, improving productivity, and other measures. In Europe, we continued to face difficult circumstances due in part to the deterioration of market conditions on top of rising costs. In Asia, we saw strong performance in Hong Kong and Taiwan.

As a result of the above, net sales for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2025 increased by 8.4% year on year to ¥662,380 million. On the profit side, operating profit increased by 23.2% year on year to ¥80,515 million, ordinary profit increased by 29.4% to ¥84,015 million, and profit attributable to owners of parent increased by 33.0% to ¥57,512 million.

The following describes performance by segment.

Segment results show the figures before elimination of inter-segment transactions.

(1) Japan

Net sales amounted to ¥287,676 million, an 8.3% year-on-year increase, with segment income of ¥35,841 million, a 27.2% increase.

(2) North America

Net sales amounted to ¥245,505 million, an 11.6% year-on-year increase (a 3.5% increase on a local currency basis), with segment income of ¥41,503 million, a 20.3% increase.

(3) Europe

Net sales amounted to ¥114,356 million, a 2.5% year-on-year increase (a 4.4% decrease on a local currency basis), with segment income of ¥3,405 million, a 12.5% decrease.

(4) Asia

Net sales amounted to ¥15,354 million, a 7.0% year-on-year increase, with segment income of ¥373 million, a 35.2% decrease.

(2) Financial Position

As of March 31, 2025, total assets increased by ¥42,908 million from the end of the previous fiscal year, to ¥534,609 million, primarily due to increases in inventories and non-current assets. Liabilities increased by ¥4,217 million from the end of the previous fiscal year, to ¥210,417 million, due mainly to an increase in income taxes payable and contract liabilities. Net assets increased by ¥38,690 million from the end of the previous fiscal year to ¥324,192 million, due mainly to increases in retained earnings and foreign currency translation adjustment.

As a result, the shareholders' equity ratio increased by 2.5 points from the end of the previous fiscal year to 60.2%.

(3) Cash Flows

As of March 31, 2025, cash and cash equivalents increased by ¥8,919 million from the end of the previous fiscal year, to ¥103,114 million. Cash flows by category during the fiscal year under review are as follows.

Cash flows from operating activities

Net cash provided by operating activities amounted to ¥76,942 million (net cash of ¥72,427 million was provided in the previous fiscal year), mainly due to the recording of profit before income taxes.

Cash flows from investing activities

Net cash used in investing activities came to ¥30,174 million (net cash of ¥24,819 million was used in the previous fiscal year), mainly attributable to payments for purchase of non-current assets.

Cash flows from financing activities

Net cash used in financing activities totaled ¥42,890 million (net cash of ¥26,244 million was used in the previous fiscal year), mainly due to payment of cash dividends.

(4) Forecast and Plans for the Future

The global economy is expected to continue facing outlooks of further uncertainty due to intensifying trade friction caused by the U.S. tariff policy and increasing uncertainty in the political and economic situation.

Amid this environment, the Sanwa Group started the Mid-Term Management Plan 2027 toward the goals of the Sanwa Global Vision 2030 in fiscal year 2025. We will steadily implement the following basic strategies to strengthen and expand a foundation toward becoming a global leader in high-performance entrance solutions to meet the changing needs of society due to climate change and digitalization.

Basic Strategies

- 1. Strengthen and expand core businesses in Japan, North America, and Europe
- 2. Grow Asian business with solid profits
- 3. Expand business through disaster preparedness products, climate change response products, and smart products and services
- 4. Increase productivity and expand production capacity through digitalization and manufacturing innovation
- 5. Enhance sustainability management and human capital management

In consideration of the above, the forecast for consolidated financial results in the next fiscal year is as follows.

(5) Basic Profit Appropriation Policy and Dividends for Fiscal 2024 and Fiscal 2025

To further promote management aimed at increasing corporate value while also improving the corporate structure and strengthening the management foundation, the Company aims to maintain a stable dividend payout ratio under its basic policy to distribute profits based on consolidated performance, specifically targeting a payout ratio of 40% of profit attributable to owners of parent.

For fiscal 2024, the Company plans to pay a year-end dividend of ¥59.0 (annual dividend of ¥106.0), an increase of ¥12.0 from the most recently announced dividend, taking into consideration the business results for fiscal 2024 and future business development.

For the next fiscal year, the Company has established a basic policy of increasing corporate value over the medium to long term through management that focuses on the balance between financial stability and capital efficiency, optimal fund distribution between investment for sustainable growth and shareholder returns, with an eye on the cost of capital and stock price. In order to provide more stable dividends, the Company has changed the guideline for its dividend policy from a dividend payout ratio of 40% to a dividend on equity (DOE) ratio of approximately 8%. This is equivalent to maintaining ROE at 18% or higher and a dividend payout ratio of 45%.

Taking into consideration the earnings forecast and the change in dividend policy for the next fiscal year, the Company plans to increase its annual dividend by ¥18.0 from ¥106.0 to ¥124.0 (¥62.0 paid at the end of the second quarter and ¥62.0 at the end of the fiscal year).

Retained earnings will be utilized for strategic investments such as M&A, as well as capital expenditures and reduction of interest-bearing debt.

2. Basic Concept of Selecting Accounting Standards

The Sanwa Group applies Japanese GAAP in its accounting. Going forward, the Group will closely monitor future trends as they pertain to the application of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

(Notes on Changes in Accounting Policies)

(Application of "Accounting Standard for Current Income Taxes", etc.)

The Accounting Standard for Current Income Taxes (ASBJ Statement No. 27, October 28, 2022, Accounting Standards Board of Japan; "Revised Accounting Standard of 2022") and others were applied from the beginning of the current consolidated fiscal year.

With respect to the revision concerning the classification of income taxes (taxation on other comprehensive income), the transitional treatment stipulated in the proviso of "Revised Accounting Standard of 2022" 20-3 and the proviso of Paragraph 65-2 (2) of the Implementation Guidance on Tax Effect Accounting (ASBJ Guidance No. 28, October 28, 2022, Accounting Standards Board of Japan; "Revised Guidance of 2022") is being followed. There is no effect of this change in accounting policy on the consolidated financial statements.

Regarding the revision related to the revised treatment in consolidated financial statements of the deferral for tax purposes of gains or losses arising from the sale of shares of subsidiaries and other securities among consolidated companies, the Revised Guidance of 2022 was applied from the beginning of the current consolidated fiscal year. This change in accounting policy has been applied retrospectively, and the consolidated financial statements for the previous consolidated fiscal year reflect this change. There is no impact on the consolidated financial statements for the previous fiscal year from this change in accounting policy.

(Segment Information, etc.)

1. Outline of reportable segments

Reportable segments of the Group are components for which discrete financial information is available and which are subject to regular discussion by the Board of Directors of the Company, the highest management decision-making body, to make decisions on the allocation of management resources and assess performance.

The Group is primarily engaged in the manufacture and sales of construction materials for commercial and residential buildings, as well as the maintenance and service business for these products. The Group mainly comprises Sanwa Shutter Corporation in Japan, Overhead Door Corporation in North America, Novoferm GmbH in Europe, and Shanghai Baosteel-Sanwa Door Co., Ltd., SANWA SHUTTER (HK) Ltd., AnHo Metal Industrial Co., Ltd., Vina-Sanwa Company Liability Ltd., SUZUKI SHUTTER (HK) Ltd., Sanwa Holdings (Shanghai) Co., Ltd., Sanwa Novoferm (Changshu) Co., Ltd., and AUB Limited in Asia. Local legal entities are independent management units, and formulate overall regional management strategies for their products and conduct separate business activities.

Accordingly, the Group is comprised of regional segments and divided into legal entities, based on the manufacture and sales systems. The Group's four reportable segments are "Japan," "North America," "Europe," and "Asia."

The major products and services of each reportable segment are as follows:

Japan

Rolling shutters, shutter-related products, door products for buildings, partitions, stainless steel products, store front products, window products, residential door products, exterior products, residential garage door products, automatic door products, and the maintenance and service business, etc.

North America

Rolling shutters, shutter-related products, industrial sectional door products, residential garage door products, operator for garage doors and other doors, automatic door products, and the maintenance and service business, etc.

Europe

Rolling shutters, shutter-related products, door products, industrial sectional door products, residential garage door products, operator for garage doors and other doors, and the maintenance and service business, etc.

Asia

Rolling shutters, shutter-related products, door products, residential garage door products, and the maintenance and service business, etc.

Inter-segment transactions are inter-company transactions and are based on market price and other relevant factors.
