Disclosure of Economic Solvency Ratio as of March 31, 2016

Japan Post Insurance Co., Ltd. (the "Company"; Chiyoda-ku, Tokyo; Masami Ishii, Director and President, CEO, Representative Executive Officer) hereby announces that the Economic Solvency Ratio Note 1 ("ESR") as of March 31, 2016 has been calculated as described below.

Starting from the fiscal year ended March31, 2016, in calculating EV, the ultimate forward rate ("UFR") is used in extrapolation of risk-free rates. Consequently, modifications have been made to the internal framework such as the adoption of the UFR also in measuring integrated risk amount based on economic value.

ESR as of March 31, 2016 was 167%.

ESR is one of the financial soundness indicators for insurance companies indicating whether a sufficient amount of capital is secured for the amount of risk, and is the capital amount divided by the risk amount, which are valuated using economic value-based assets and liabilities. The Company calculates the value in general pursuant to principals of the EU Solvency II directives.

 - 3. Integrated risk amount based on economic value was calculated using an internal framework, whereby fluctuations in EV are regarded as risks, subject to certain adjustment for a one-year period to a 99.5% confidence level on a post-tax basis upon taking into account the effects of diversification, loss absorption of policyholder dividends and certain other factors.)

The internal framework is modified as necessary, which may affect the method of calculation and results.
